### DEFEND IMMIGRANT RIGHTS! MAKE CEDAR RAPIDS SAFE FOR UNDOCUMENTED WORKERS!

(Note: Our campaign to make Cedar Rapids a sanctuary city is underway. To sign our petition, get in touch with a local SA member.)

Latino(a), black, Asian, Arab and white, immigrants with and without papers, we are all Iowans. Our lives and futures are inextricably linked. Immigration policies that limit our civil rights and freedoms, and divide our families, based on which side of an arbitrary line we happened to be born, are barbaric and untenable.

The ICE raids and deportations, which rip apart families, separating mother from child, brother from sister, classmate from classmate, are racist kidnappings, today's version of the fugitive slave laws that terrorized northern black communities in the 1850s. ICE agents are the modern-day slave-catchers

whose aim is to terrorize, intimidate, and undercut the political strength of Latino communities, and cause all immigrant communities to live in fear of random harassment and deportations.

While undocumented students have the formal legal right to attend public schools in Iowa, this right is under attack by predatory ICE raids and Governor-Elect Terry Branstad's desires to bar the children of undocumented workers from attending public schools and bettering their futures.

The policy of repression against our immigrant brothers and sisters is bipartisan. Only by standing together can workers both native-born and immigrant guarantee the highest possible wages and conditions, quality education, full employment and equal rights. We cannot effectively organize union or social struggles if we are divided against ourselves.

#### THE FIFTH SEASON IS PROGRESS?

(Note: At a recent 'Progress Report' sponsored by the City of Cedar Rapids, the Mayor and various city representatives spoke on the 'great strides' made towards recovering C.R. From the flood of '08. Socialist Action members were present to castigate the Mayor for his blatant disregard of democracy during the reconstruction process, exemplified by the city's desires to demolish several neighborhoods of workers' homes against the will of the homeowners and replace them with an expanded business district. Below is Cedar Rapids Socialist Action's counter-statement to the official 'Progress Report.')

With over two years having gone by since the 2008 flood that devastated Cedar Rapids, a certain recovery is beginning to take shape – just not the kind of recovery that benefits working people. While the business district is being restored, working families languish in housing limbo.

Homes are set to be demolished in order to build playgrounds for the rich and well-to-do, leaving the preflood homeowners to fend for themselves. Now they find themselves in the same boat as those who rented apartments damaged by the flood: renters have entirely fallen through the cracks. This social devastation was preventable, but because levees aren't immediately profitable for the rich and powerful, it was allowed to occur.

The regime of capitalism has turned this disaster into a tragedy. City, state and federal government officials are all complicit. They say that there's no money for an orderly recovery, or for that matter education or jobs, yet they have plenty of money to finance tax cuts for the super rich, bank bailouts, and the brutal occupations of Iraq and Afghanistan.

It's time to stand up to the class and government that consistently puts profits over human needs.

#### COPS IN HIGH SCHOOL – AND THEY AREN'T THERE TO LEARN

As part of the increasing degeneration of the public school system – not only in the U.S. but worldwide – Washington High School recently announced its decision to station a Cedar Rapids Police Department officer on school grounds full-time. While they claim that this move is in response to a fight on school property, a fight in which neither participant was armed and no injuries were dealt, the real message to students and faculty is clear: the eyes of the law are on you, so you'd better sit down and shut up.

From as far away as France to right here in the United States, the struggle of teachers and high school / university students for higher education standards and social justice has been increasing. March 4<sup>th</sup> and October 7<sup>th</sup> saw massive mobilizations of students from coast to coast against the austerity and education cutbacks being imposed on them; and due to the combination of Obama's No Child Left Behind-inspired "Race to the Top" program and state-level cuts to schools that began under Culver and will be continued by Branstad, the set is stage for a fightback in Iowa.

There have already been three demonstrations against education cuts since the beginning of the year, two of which were organized by Socialist Action and the other by an Iowa City teachers' union. With more attacks on the way, more defensive struggles by teachers and students are inevitable. We must not let ruling class intimidation stifle our struggle for education.
